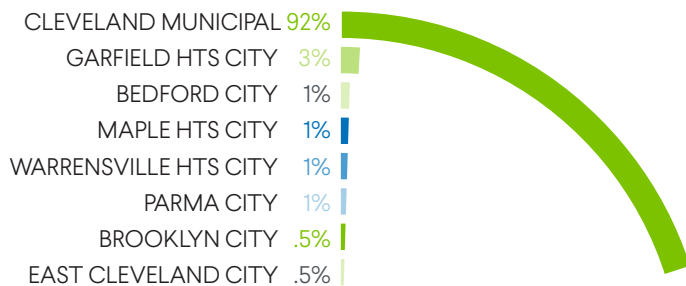

- Expanded leadership support included Deborah Franklin and award-winning Executive Principal Willie Banks for the 2024-25 school year

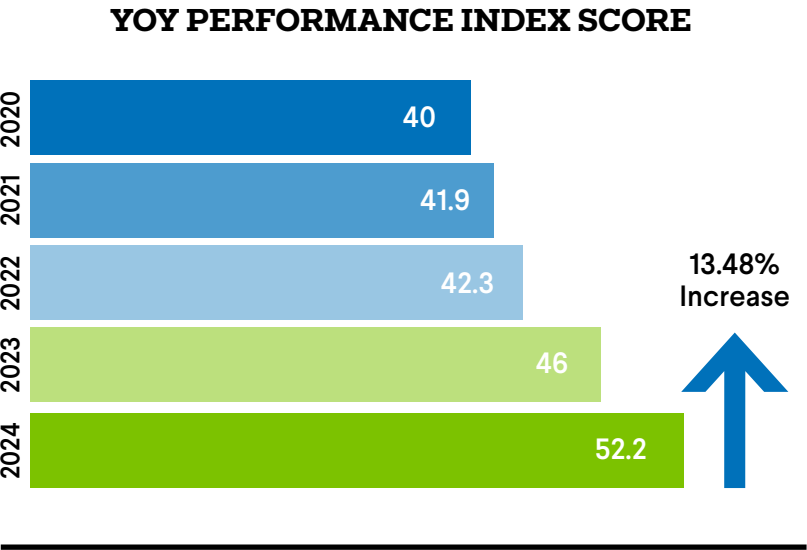
